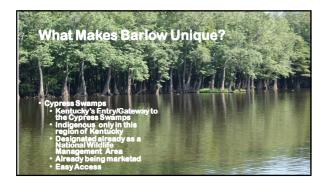

Beautification



- Walk each street and take photographs of every detriment of the community.

 Take pictures of all the things that could be improved upon. For example: signage, store fronts, railing, fences, fire hydrants, and parking stripes. What else do you notice?

 Assess what can be removed, cleaned up, painted, changed, replaced or updated Create a clean up plan, short and long term.

 Organize volunteers to paint, take down out of date, dilapidated signage, plant flowers, and spruce up the town!

Beautification

- Look at other cities that you admire and cherry pick ideas.
- Work with community partners and schedule a clean up day. Bring in a dumpster, get volunteers to provide a truck and offer to haul for your neighbors.
- Contact property owners of other eyesores and organize volunteers to assist in cleaning them up.
- If you plant flowers and trees, make sure to have a watering, maintenance and replacement plan in place.

Create an Economic Development Incubator

- Re-purpose empty buildings as business incubators
- Recruit entrepreneurs with ideas
- Promote/advertise
- Streamline licensing procedures
- Provide small business training
- Seek mentors such as SCORE to assist new business owners



Economic Development

- Focus on existing businesses in town, what will support them?
- Capitalize on natural environment for added value ATV and canoe/kayak outfitters for example
- Look at thriving businesses in nearby communities, or other river towns; would any of them be a fit? Could they be recruited for a second location?
- Offer free Wi-Fi in the city
- Work with the Kentucky Economic Development Cabinet to assess the potential for a full-service truck stop with overnight accommodations.
 Integrate with KY Department of Tourism to cross promote
- Create a web presence for Barlow
- Create a welcome center with public restrooms to get traffic to stop in town

Eco and Adventure Tourism



 Create a walking and driving tour of all the unique offerings in your community. Include things like local history, the river, the bridges, architecture, unusual draws such as the coffin at the Cedar Chips and Hillbilly Still.

- Trail Development

 In addition to ATV, horse, biking, and hiking trails, water trails are a must to exploit the cypress swamps.

 Become the advocate and protector of the trails and the swamps.
- Involve local youth help them see the value of this environmental treasure



A Teaching Resource

- Reach out to partners and offer a location for training workshops.
 Develop two and three day workshops related to natural environment, animals, birds, fish and astronomy
 Provide gathering space, free parking, restrooms and high-speed internet access
