Our Public Officials Essential Skills Institute (POESI) is a voluntary continuing education program established to encourage and recognize the efforts of city officials to become effective leaders.

Public Officials Essential Skills Institute

POESI certificate program credit can be earned by all KLC Leadership Center students who attend educational workshops and complete the Attendance Verification Form. The forms can be turned in at the convention Registration counter.

You May Be Closer Than You Think

The 2007 KLC Convention & Expo is a great way to meet POESI certificate requirements. You'll be recognized at the City Achievement Awards Luncheon where public officials who have earned a bronze, silver, or gold award will receive their accolades. Program Components: New and Improved

Public officials will be recognized at three award levels for successfully completing 24 hours of training, offered by KLC. Up to six hours of outside and elective credit may be applied towards each award level through:

1. Experience based credit, given only at the Bronze Certificate level, for public officials who have served four or more years in office.
2. Service to the Kentucky League of Cities, Kentucky Boards and Commissions and the National League of Cities is granted only in the Silver and Gold Certificate levels.
3. Outside credit for approved conferences and workshops not offered through the KLC Leadership Center.

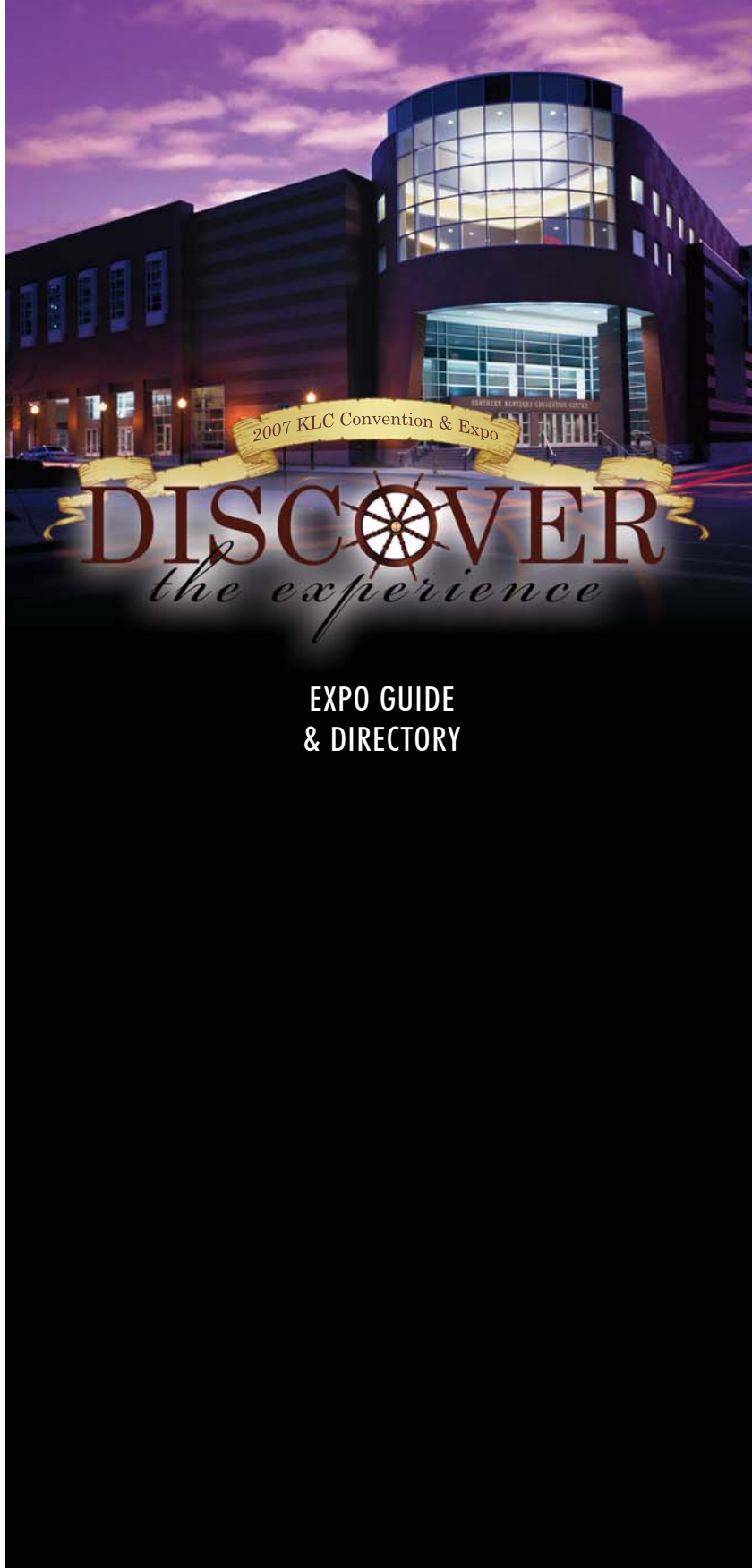

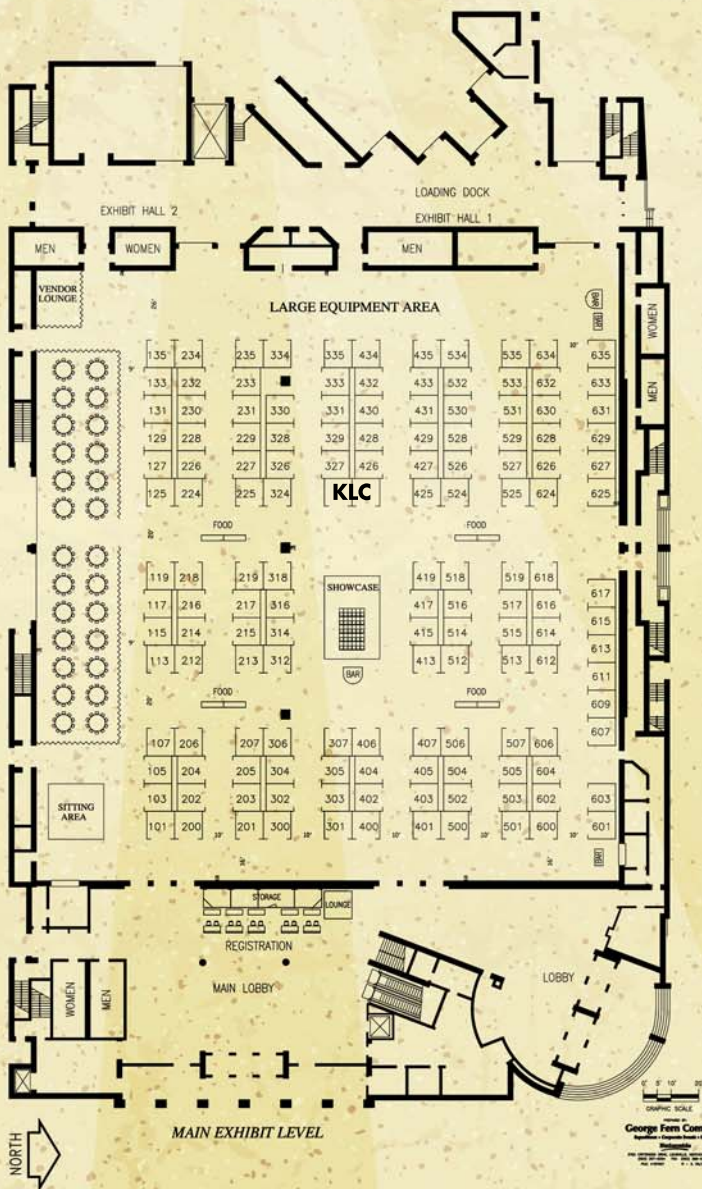

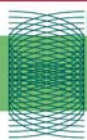
