What are our Strengths?





Agriculture





- Collateral development:
 - Education (KCTC * Folk School * UK Extension * Amish)
 - Teaching farming
 - Teaching cooking/prep/preservation
 - Wine making
- Restaurant development centered in downtowns and rural settings
- Wine making and Distilleries
- Marketing value-added Hart County products to broader region

Natural Resources Development Plan

The story of the creation of the split white oak basket in Hart County is a cultural treasure. This unique craft is in danger because the craftsmen are aging, and there is no plan in place to insure the continued existence of this art. The split white oak basket is also an economic development opportunity.

The Mammoth Cave Basket Guild carries the torch for this art form. The community needs to assist in the effort to mentor new basket weavers. There are potential funding opportunities. But first, the target trainees must be identified. They could include students, community service workers, and therapy patients.







Natural Resource Development

- ID plants and minerals that can be used sustainably and to which value can be added
 - Examples white oak baskets, barrels, pottery from local materials
- Collateral development:
 - Education (KCTC, Folk School, Craftsman Guild)
 - harvesting
 - crafting
- Marketing and Sales
 - Create a Local Food/Local Crafts Market – Storefront at I-65 Exit Bonnieville



Recreation Development


Recreation potential in Hart County

- Bike
- Hike
- Paddle

- Cave

Examples include

- Cub Run
- Nolin Lake
- Re-imagine the cave area
- Nature Conservancy WKU
- Build on Green River recreation area – connect to Greensburg
- ATV Trails Adventure Tourism
- Frenchman's Knob recreational area

Connectors



Connect Nolin Lake, Mammoth Cave and Green River State Park with Trails

Develop a Recreation Master Plan linking recreation activities

For example:

- Bike from a B&B to a cave
- Then to lunch at a rural store/restaurant
- Bike to an afternoon of canoeing on the Green River
- Then back to downtown for a music festival downtown







Collateral Development

- Supplies

- Need renovated living spaces above storefronts for B&Bs, hotels
- Restaurants
- Artists
- Music
- Pocket parks and plazas




Tourism Development Plan as an Economic Development Strategy

- Driving Tour
 - ID key locations
 - Hwy 728 Loop tours/B&B/Amish
 - Wayfinding plan
 - Rest stops
- Educational Tourism host people from elsewhere to learn
- Collateral Development:

 - Restaurants
 - Arts and crafts
 - Entertainment
