The new rule covers specifics for general industry and construction including: the history of silica, the new permissible exposure limit (PEL) vs. the previous PEL formula, exposure assessment, regulated areas, engineering controls, personal protective equipment, medical surveillance, recordkeeping and compliance dates for general industry and construction. Engineering and work practice controls for Table 1 in construction will be included. This course will help employers understand the new requirements of the new silica rule.
