IEEE Smart city frame work – Developed in KY “Snapshot”

IoT deployments must protect and respect the privacy of citizens and visitors. Cities should be committed to being open and transparent about the context of data collection, transmission, processing and storage.

Connectivity	Version	Label	Description
	1.1	Wire Frame	Smart cities should begin with wireframe diagrams showing how the smart city as a whole will work. Once this definition is created components can be added in a structured manner.
	1.2	Outcome	IoT devices and platforms (e.g. how data is collected, analyzed and used) should be designed with the outcome in mind (e.g. predicting traffic demand based on data patterns, weather and events) which will optimize benefits which created insights from data collection (e.g. routing transit vehicles more efficiently). Data exchanges should be targets for data which provide relevant business and historical data from IoT platforms.
	1.3	Minimize data	Data measurement will require collection and categorization in an efficient manner. Goals for data systems should be to send the least amount of data to ensure outcomes are achieved. (e.g. send voltage .01 to signify density is 1 percent in a given area)
	1.4	Control	IoT data should be indexed rather than collect from disparate systems. Searching can be done effectly cross platform in this manner. Sending of data should only be done if a system requires the communication for function to achieve outcome. All connections should be completed through open standards such as application programming interfaces (API's), as well as software development kits (SDKs) where possible.
	1.5	Market place	Citys should have a defined data exchange made available for buy side, sell side and general use (For city needs / open portal). Data portals should have documented interfaces including API's and SDKs which utilize a tierd data structure for production, testing, archiving. See security controls regarding access requirements.
	1.6	Portals	Open portals should utilize democratized processes ensuring development, curation, and refinement benefits are had by all. (e.g. user 1 joins 2 tables and waits for the indexing to occur. That join should not be made available for all others)
	1.7	Validation	All IoT Devices systems should be paired in such a way that validation occurs seamlessly. (e.g. all temperature sensors should be categorized and groups with other like devices for comparatize results). All sensors should require GPS coordinates and labeling to ensure tracking and identification is capable on the system. Robust active security and end of life protocols should be enforced.
	1.8	Management	All IoT systems will be controlled through platforms which monitor health, validity, and location for all devices. These platforms should be capable of sending information to a central platform (Platform on Platform) if required by city for governance.
	1.9	Testing	Test driven development methodology should be implemented to automatically QA all data ingested into central repositories. This lower operating costs and create a more efficient data enviroment.
	2		Centralized Platform on platform technology should be designed to ensure all devices have proper governance. Requirements such as API / SDK along with TDD (Test Driven Development) protocols will allow the city to create a data enviroment which has all asset information including but not limited to network type, Security protocols, service levels.

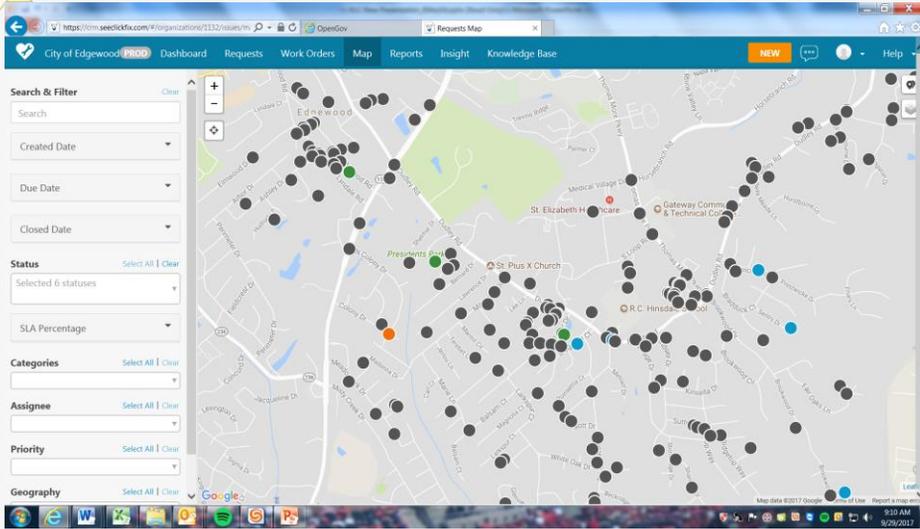




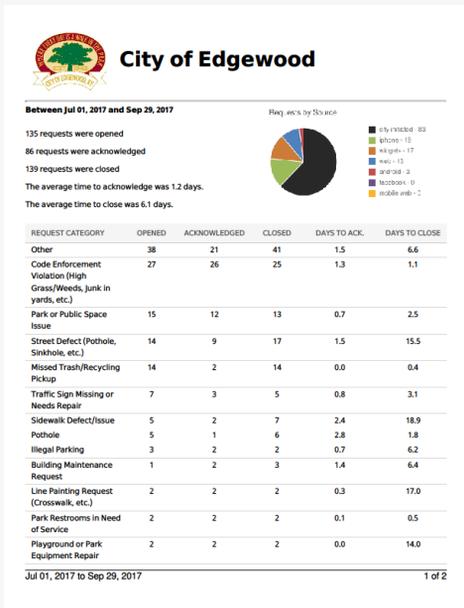

City of Edgewood – Engage Heat Mapping

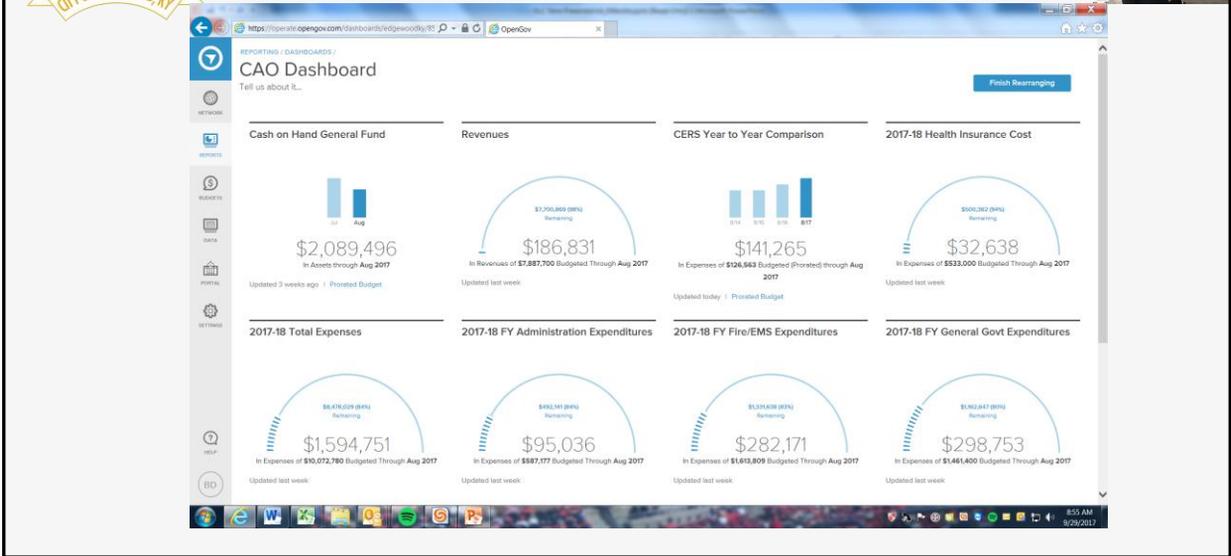

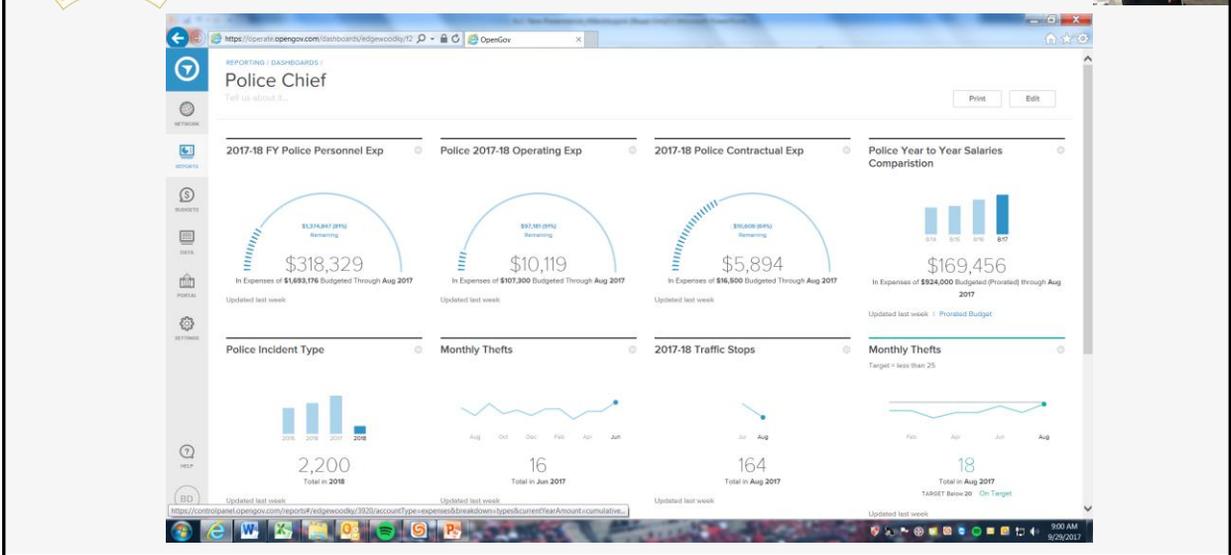




City of Edgewood – OpenGov Dashboards
