

Strains

1. A police officer supervising an honor guard detail at a funeral had a stroke, seizure, and brain rupture.
2. A police officer began experiencing chest pains while working a motor vehicle accident.

Arrests

1. A police officer was attempting to arrest a subject who began to resist, striking the officer in the face and causing both to fall to the ground. The officer suffered bruising to the face and scrapes on his knees.
2. A police officer was placing a female under arrest when, due to her aggressive nature, he had to take her to the ground, causing the officer to hit his knee.
3. While placing a female subject under arrest, an officer was forced to take her to the ground. During the altercation, the subject struck the officer in the face.
4. During an arrest, a subject bit a police officer on his bicep.

Training

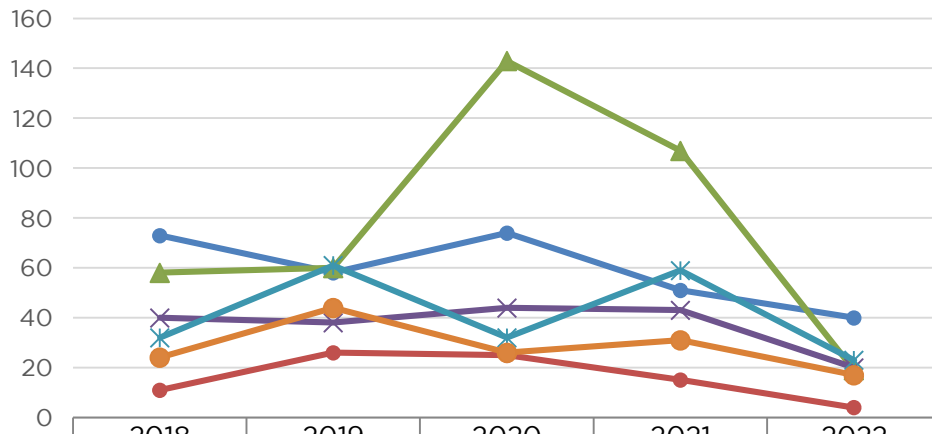
