



Strains

1. A police officer placing a deceased subject into a body bag strained his back lifting the bag onto the gurney.
2. A police officer reaching for a subject felt a strain in his lower back.

Strains from Motor Vehicle Collisions

1. A police officer in a motor vehicle collision struck his head against the driver's window and strained a finger.

Exposures:

Animal & Human Bites

1. A K-9 that had been struck bit an officer on the hand officer as the officer attempted to move the dog from the roadway.
2. A police officer responding to an overdose call was bitten on the wrist while attempting to control the subject.
3. A kitten bit an officer on the finger as she removed it from an engine compartment.

Needle Sticks

1. A dirty needle poked a police officer when the officer searched a subject detained for shoplifting. The subject had two needles in his pocket.
2. A needle in a subject's pants stuck an officer who was patting down the subject.

Bodily Fluids

1. An officer placing a subject with MRSA under arrest touched the subject's skin without any protective gloves.

Arrests

1. A police officer strained her wrist when she used utilized force to place a subject into custody.
2. A police officer's ankle slipped off the sidewalk as he attempted to place a subject who was resisting arrest into custody. The subject's body weight landed on the officer's ankle.
