




Cause	CompanyNurseInfo
Arrests	<b>Cut to the forehead:</b> The employee stated he was involved in a foot pursuit. The suspect put her hands in the air. As he was taking her into custody, a Phillips screwdriver in her hand stabbed him in the forehead above his left eye.
Arrests	<b>Pain and tightness to the right ring finger/Scratches on both hands:</b> The employee stated he was taking a gentleman into custody. The gentleman turned around, confronted the officer, and pushed him to the ground.
Arrests	<b>Head pain:</b> The supervisor stated they were arresting a subject. The subject headbutted the employee as they were taking the subject back to the car.
Arrests	<b>Left bicep pain:</b> The employee was arresting a suspect who was resisting arrest. During the process, the employee pulled their left bicep.
Arrests	<b>Right shoulder pain/Swelling to the right elbow:</b> The employee pulled his right shoulder trying to get an uncooperative suspect into the back of the police car.
Cuts	<b>Cut to left hand:</b> The employee stated that he was searching an arrested individual when he broke a glass pipe in the man's pocket. The employee placed his hands on it without gloves, cutting his hand.
Cuts	<b>Three-inch cut in left palm:</b> The employee stated he was cutting metal when the grinder kicked back and cut him in the palm of his left hand.
Exposure	<b>Cough/Tuberculosis exposure:</b> The employee stated he responded to a call where a homeowner was positive for tuberculosis. The employee was exposed to the homeowner.
Exposure	<b>No symptoms yet:</b> The employee stated that while responding to a call, he went into a residence and was exposed to airborne tuberculosis.
Exposure	<b>No symptoms:</b> The employee was possibly exposed to dangerous drugs after arresting a suspect. The coworker was transported to the hospital.
Exposure	<b>Possible bodily fluid exposure to her right hand:</b> The officer was searching through some jeans and a jacket when an unknown sharp object poked her right hand.
Misc.	<b>Saliva exposure:</b> The employee stated that he responded to an emotional crisis. The person became combative and spat on the right side of the employee's face.
Misc.	<b>No medical complaints:</b> The employee stated that he and his coworker responded to a domestic call. The male subject attempted to flee the scene with a bag of Kratom. The employee and his coworker were trying to apprehend the suspect when he tried to strike the employee. The employee was able to restrain the suspect. However, when the suspect tried to strike them, the employee and his coworker were exposed to the Kratom.
Misc.	<b>Left hip pain:</b> The employee stated he was on honor guard for the new officers' graduation. The employee stated that the joint on his left hip started hurting the next day, and he is now having trouble walking for more than 30 minutes.
Misc.	<b>No symptoms at this time:</b> The employee responded to a call at an apartment. The suspect tried to flee carrying a 1-pound bag of Kratom. In the altercation, the bag exploded, and Kratom got all over the employee and his coworker.
Motor Vehicle	<b>General soreness:</b> The employee stated that while working, he had a motor vehicle accident involving his supervisor, totaling both vehicles.
Motor Vehicle	<b>No medical complaints:</b> The employee stated he was driving. A vehicle ran a stop sign and hit the front driver's side of his vehicle.
Motor Vehicle	<b>Soreness and bruised right elbow:</b> The employee stated that he was driving when a vehicle hit his car.
Motor Vehicle	<b>Soreness below his shoulder, leg, and above kidney:</b> The employee stated he was driving when a car hit his vehicle. Another vehicle hit his vehicle after the first collision. The employee injured his left shoulder, leg, and above his kidney.
Strains	<b>Pain and swelling to the right hand/Bruising to the right palm:</b> The employee was practicing breaching doors with a ram when he jarred his right hand.   Previously Treated: No
Strains	<b>Right ankle pain:</b> The employee responded to a vehicle fire on the interstate. As he walked over to take pictures of the vehicle, he stepped into a large hole, injuring his right ankle.
Strains	<b>Pain to the right palm in the middle of his hand:</b> The employee was trying to regain control of a resisting prisoner. He strained his right hand while handcuffing the prisoner.
Strains	<b>Pain and swelling to right ankle:</b> The employee knocked on a door and stepped off the porch into a hole. He felt a pop in his right ankle.
Strains	<b>Pop, tenderness, tightness, and difficulty walking on the right knee:</b> The employee was looking for a shoplifter who ran. The suspect was hiding in a wooded area. The suspect began to run. The employee pursued him, stepping in a hole. He felt a pop in his right knee.
Striking against	<b>Mild right hand pain/Bruising and swelling to the knuckles of the right middle and pinkie finger:</b> The employee stated she responded to a call about a baby trapped in a vehicle on fire. She knocked on the doors of all nearby residents and told them to evacuate because of the fire, injuring her right hand in the process.
Struck By	<b>Black and swollen left eye:</b> The employee stated that he was practicing Jiu-Jitsu, and he was hit in the left eye.
Struck By	<b>Body fluid exposure to his face/Left elbow scrape:</b> The employee states that a juvenile was acting out of control, so he handcuffed him. The juvenile kicked the officer's lower leg and spat on his face.
Struck By	<b>Minor left knee cap pain:</b> The employee stated that a person hit him with the front of his car.
Struck By	<b>Right hand puncture:</b> The employee was assisting a coworker in arresting a suspect. The employee inspected the suspect's purse and removed items when they felt a prick on their middle finger.
Struck By	<b>Leftcalf tenderness and bruising:</b> The employee stated he was with his supervisor and two other officers who were arresting an individual. Another officer attempted to strike the individual on the legs with the baton but hit the employee's left leg in the calf area.
