



FOR KLCIS WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE MEMBERS!

The 2022 Workers' Compensation Safety Grant is now open at www.klc.org.

Eligibility

- ◆ The applying city or agency must be a current member of the KLC Insurance Services program with workers' compensation (WC) insurance coverage.
- ◆ KLC will only accept one application from each insured member.

Application period: March 7, 2022 – April 15, 2022

- ◆ Applications must be submitted online via www.klc.org. You will immediately receive a confirmation email once a submission is successful.
- ◆ Receipts, purchase orders, and invoices dated July 1, 2021, to April 15, 2022, must be uploaded at the time of application.
- ◆ Due to the popularity of this grant, we advise members to apply early.
- ◆ If applications exceed funds available, KLC will process grants on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Safety Grant is a 50/50 matching grant.

- ◆ Members with WC coverage with total premiums before taxes less than \$35,000 are eligible for up to \$1,500 grant reimbursements for approved purchases.
- ◆ Members with WC coverage with total premiums before taxes of \$35,000 and above are eligible for up to \$3,000 grant reimbursements for approved purchases.
- ◆ Members applying for personal protective equipment (PPE) must complete the PPE Hazard Assessment and attach a copy to the grant at the time of application.

ELIGIBLE ITEMS



- Personal protective equipment (must complete PPE Hazard Assessment and attach a copy with application) – does not include body armor due to other funding available
- Defensive driver training
- Telematic systems used to enforce fleet safety and influence safe driving behaviors
- Puncture-resistant gloves and sharps containers
- KLCIS Risk & Safety Conference – Reimbursement of \$300 for each person with a full registration
- Yaktrax or similar snow and ice traction footwear devices
- Safety training from an outside contractor
- Utilities safety manuals (e.g., APPA, AGA)
- Table saws with auto stop blade breaks (e.g., Saw Stop)
- Confined space equipment (including calibration of air monitors)
- Trenching and shoring safety equipment
- Lift-assist stretchers and chairs (including batteries)
- Work zone safety equipment (signage and cones only)
- Fall prevention equipment, including adjustable platforms with protective rails
- Remote-operated robotic mowers for mowing steep slopes, difficult terrain, and other hazardous landscapes

Please note that this list targets the most frequent causes of loss among KLC-insured members. These categories may change from year to year. Only items listed will be accepted for this grant period.



All grants are dependent on the availability of funds.
